English Language Proficiency

(20 U.S.C. Section 6312(e)(3)(A)(vi))

The goal of language acquisition programs is to ensure that all students are able to communicate effectively in English.

The expected rate of graduation for students in this program is 85%.

Parents or guardians may choose a language acquisition program that best suits their child (EC Section 310). Language acquisition programs are educational programs designed to ensure English acquisition occurs as rapidly and effectively as possible. They provide instruction to EL students based on the state-adopted academic content standards, including English language development (ELD) standards (20 U.S.C. Section 6312[e][3][A][iii],[v]); EC Section 306[c]).

We are required to offer, at minimum, a **EL** program option (EC Section 305[a][2]). It is a language acquisition program for EL students in which nearly all classroom instruction is provided in English, but with curriculum and a presentation designed for students who are learning English. At minimum, students are offered designated ELD and provided access to grade level academic subject matter content with integrated ELD.
